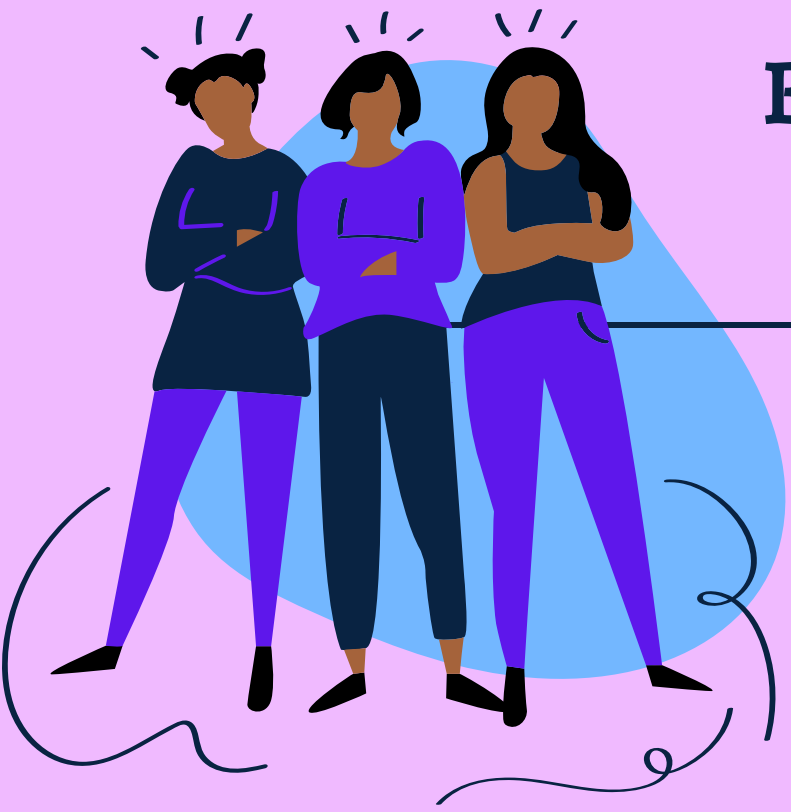

- ♥ "I love being dignified, unafraid to speak my mind."
- ♥ "Everything/everyone comes from a Black woman!!!"
- ♥ "We can build community anywhere"
- ♥ "Ain't no friends in here, who wants a T-shirt?"
- ♥ "I am still here because of a praying mother and a WHOLE lot of second chances."
- ♥ "The 'angry black woman' trope is sometimes why I hesitate to speak up at meetings--really want to work on using my voice more and expressing when something is uncomfortable or not right."

We wear the mask.

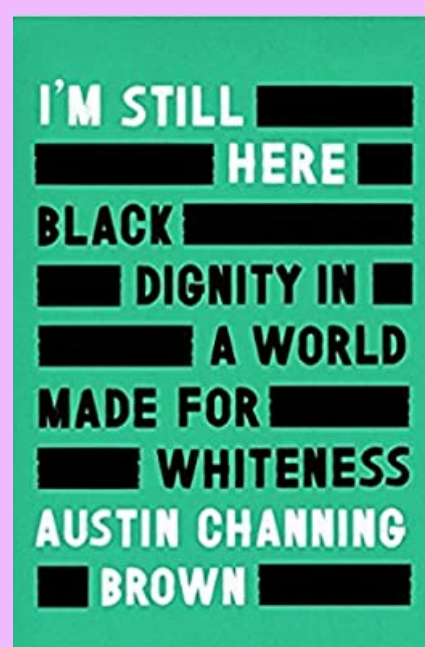
We smile, but, O great Christ, our cries
